BCS Developments

As part of the re-structuring of the Society, the old Branches Board has been replaced by a Branches Management Committee (BMC). We are fortunate that Iain Thompson of Edinburgh Branch Committee has been elected to BMC, so we have a direct voice there. A larger forum, Branches Congress, meets twice per year, generally in September and April, and is the interface between the Branches and the two key Committees, BMC and Member Services Board. Two Representatives of each Branch Committee attend Congress. Any BCS member is welcome to suggest an issue, or a discussion topic which they would like their Branch Reps to put forward to Congress. Edinburgh Branch Committee is always keen to hear your views, so do email us.

The BCS has recently launched a new e-mail List Server as part of the Society's Web Enablement Programme, **BCS Connect**. It is a facility available for use by BCS HQ, Branches, Specialist Groups, Forums, Boards and Committees to send email communications to members and other contacts.

For many years now the BCS Edinburgh Branch has been using a list BCS-EDIN kindly hosted by Heriot-Watt University. We used this e-mail list to publicise our Branch events and other items of relevant interest to the Branch membership. As part of the BCS Connect initiative the Edinburgh Branch is now moving its Branch e-mail list to the new BCS service

The new Branch e-mail list will be a *broadcast* list where only the Branch Secretary (Mike Hurst) and Branch Membership Secretary (Peter Barker) are authorised to post to the list. We will be restricting posts to BCS Edinburgh Branch business and occasional other information we consider relevant to Branch members.

Other advantages of the BCS list server are that member e-mail addresses are automatically taken from BCS membership records, and not maintained separately. This simplifies maintenance and compliance with current data protection legislation.

By the time you read this you should have already received an e-mail welcoming you to the new e-mail list. If you have not, then it could be that your e-mail address in the BCS HQ membership database is incorrect.
